Dallas County voters approved a \$450 million bond package in May 2004 to expand the facilities of the Dallas County Community College District. Brookhaven College's portion of the bond package consists of three projects that include two new buildings and expansion of another.

SCIENCE AND ALLIED HEALTH BUILDING

Brookhaven College's new Science and Allied Health Building with a construction budget of approximately \$37,000,000, is planned to be 144,000 square feet in size. The facility will be home to college health, chemistry and biology programs and includes, but is

not limited to, new general-use and multimedia classrooms, wet and dry labs, lecture halls, computer labs, x-ray rooms, intensive care and nursing units, division and faculty offices, adjunct faculty mail and copy rooms, file and storage space and common areas to support those programs. Adjacent to the Science & Allied Health Building, a new parking lot section will be added providing approximately 350 parking spaces. Upgrades and improvements to Brookhaven's mechanical infrastructure will also will be included in this project. The building is expected to have its first classes in the winter semester of 2009.

AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY BUILDING EXPANSION

Brookhaven College's new Automotive Technology Expansion, with a construction budget of approximately \$3,140,500, is planned to consist of 12,670 square feet of new combination classroom and bay space, 2,400 square feet of reclaimed existing shop bays, 4,300 square feet of remodeled existing space to provide tool room, office, workroom, and 500 square feet of additional component storage space. It also will include 17,000 square feet of additional exterior paved automobile staging area. The facility will provide growth for Brookhaven College's National Institute for Automotive Excellence, ASE, Certified Automotive Technology Program. The building is expected to have its first classes in the fall of 2008.

WORKFORCE AND CONTINUING EDUCATION BUILDING

Brookhaven's new Workforce and Continuing Education Building, with a construction budget of approximately \$5,494,587, is planned to be 25,000 square feet in size. The facility will consist of programmatic spaces for corporate and continuing education programs, general classrooms and support space. The new building is expected to be ready for occupancy in the fall semester of 2009.
