

# Equity in Athletics Disclosure Act

Report for 2000-2001

Released October 29, 2001

All coeducational institutions of higher education that participate in any federal student financial aid program and have intercollegiate programs must provide information concerning their intercollegiate athletics programs under the Equity in Athletics Disclosure Act of 1964, section 360B of Public Law 103-382. This act and accompanying federal regulations require that the following information, based on the previous reporting year, be available for inspection by students, prospective students, and the public by October 30 each year. Information in this report covers the period beginning September 1, 2000 through August 31, 2001.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

## OPERATING EXPENSES

Operating expenses are commonly known as game-day expenses, which are those an institution incurs that are attributable to home, away, and neutral-site intercollegiate athletic contests. These expenditures include team travel, lodging, meals, transportation, officials, uniforms and equipment and are shown on the following table.

## HEAD COACHES

This table lists the number of head coaches assigned to each team, whether that coach is male or female, whether that coach is assigned to that team on a full-time or part-time basis, and whether that coach is a full-time or part-time employee of the institution. For the purposes of this report, the term “full-time coaching duties” means the individual’s employment responsibilities at the institution are exclusively those as coach of that team, and only that team, and are consistent with the institution’s definition of a full-time or part-time employee of the institution. For the purposes of this report, the term “full-time university employee” means the individual’s overall employment responsibilities at the institution are consistent with the institution’s definition of fulltime, although that individual may have responsibilities other than as coach of that team, either within the athletic department or another department of the institution.

## ASSISTANT COACHES

For the purposes of this report, the term “full-time university employee” means the individual’s overall employment responsibilities at the institution are consistent with the institution’s definition of full-time, although that individual may have responsibilities other than as coach of that team, either within the athletic department or another department of the institution.

## RECRUITING EXPENDITURES

Since Brookhaven College competes at the NJCAA Division III level, the institution does not spend money on recruiting for the men's and women's teams. Even though our baseball and softball programs compete at the NJCAA Division I level, they still follow the guidelines of Division III.

## REVENUE

Brookhaven College is a member of the Dallas County Community College District and the philosophy of the District has been not to charge for admission to any DCCCD athletic contest.

## ATHLETICALLY-RELATED STUDENT AID

Brookhaven College competes at the NJCAA Division III level. The Division III guidelines, as stated in Article VI, Section 9 of the NJCAA Handbook, prohibit an institution from awarding "athletic scholarship aid of any kind."

## HEAD COACHES' SALARIES

All head coaches have part-time contracts.

## SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

Men's baseball and women's softball both have a fall scrimmage/unofficial seasons and a spring regular/official season. Per NJCAA procedures, baseball is allowed 76 games/scrimmages with a maximum of 56 games/scrimmages in the spring while softball is allowed 40 playing dates in the spring Thus softball typically plays fewer games leading to the disparity in operating expenditures between baseball and softball.

Women's volleyball is a fall only sport unlike men's basketball which is both a fall and spring sport , thus the disparity in operating expenditures.
