REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Experience with the daily operation of an assigned unit or organization and serves as a professional consultant knowledgeable in a specific discipline, profession or industry. The ability to plan and maintain work systems, follow processes and policies that enable and encourage the unit to meet the organizational objectives.

Able to work independently and be a strong effective team player, committed to delivering timely results; with excellent organizational skills and effectively manage multiple tasks and projects simultaneously. Ability to research and proposes new methodologies and technologies to enhance the work-flow process.

The ability to respond to written and verbal inquiries from a variety of internal and external sources for the purpose of resolving problems, providing information and/or referring to the appropriate personnel and/or identifying the relevant issues and recommending a remediation plan.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Responsible for writing syntax and programming the automated degree plans used by students in tracking their progress toward degree completion. Analyzes and designs departmental systems in compliance with the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) and district guidelines. Program degrees and certificate plans in Colleague for credit and continuing education levels.

Under general supervision, develops, implements and/or maintains computer programs for information systems. Support the Reverse Transfer initiative, including review of individual transcripts for distribution to Degree Audit staff.

Work with DSC programmers and analysts to test and recommend new core and TSI programming. Collaborate with campus Degree Audit staffs to ensure deadlines are met; work with Catalog Web Team, Curriculum Management and Workforce Education to improve/revise degree plans.

Convert and design individual degree plans and awards into eAdvising syntax and coding for input into eAdvising student planning module. Conduct various duties such as training, utilizing queries and degree-mapping, and supporting the college degree audit offices.

Train practices in processing degree plans, posting course substitutions and graduation. Audit student graduation files for compliance to THECB guidelines. Process logs and create reports as requested. Meet with Degree Audit Users Group, to communicate new policies, reflect on current policies and standards and provide guidelines for implementation at all colleges.

Must complete required DCCCD Professional Development training hours per academic year. Must have excellent interpersonal, presentation, oral and written communication skills to communicate with a wide array of diverse stakeholders and constituents within the DCCCD community network.

Performs other duties as assigned.
